The superintendent should approve the data for each submission and/or resubmission by submitting the electronic Statement of Approval (SOA) before it is accepted by the ESC for submission to TEA. The district TSDS approver or designated completer will be responsible for completing/approving all Core Collection data.

TX Strategic Staffing – Paid Teacher Residency Program HR007 NEW

Texas Strategic Staffing (TSS) is a 2-year process in which a district and Education Preparation Program (EPP) commit to designing and implementing a paid teacher residency program that is sustainably funded by reallocating district resources to compensate teacher residents who take on additional instructional responsibilities in the district while completing a year-long teacher residency program.

Teacher residencies, in which candidates spend a full year student teaching under the guidance of a highly effective mentor teacher, provide candidates with the sheltered practice and support future teachers need to learn how to teach before they are responsible for their own classrooms.

The programming landscape consists of a Design Year and an Implementation Year. The Design Year is where the District and partnering EPP will work with a Region 16 Technical Assistance Provider to develop a paid teacher residency program. The Implementation Year is when the EPP places teacher residents on your campus with your mentor teacher.
